Loewen wrote "Lies My Teacher Told Me," "Lies across America" and several other books challenging white supremacy in history textbooks and the general teaching of American history. We are not "teaching what really happened." And, says Loewen, "We have a tendency in history to deify or villainize." Among other positions he takes, Loewen describes that the US is especially prone to push ethno-centrism because of our strengths militarily and economically.

Loewen, who has examined history textbooks and US teaching, offers examples of how the trends in teaching have reflected and reinforced institutional racism. The title of the interview comes from our lack of understanding of Lincoln's motives in the Civil War, and what gets left out or preserved in his speeches and writing in order to reinforce a pre-determined narrative. Loewen also offers that we no longer need textbooks. With the internet and other access, we can now have myriad sources to reflect diverse perspectives and inspire thinking and come closer to historical debate and truth.
