
## The Program



## Enhancing school-related competencies and reducing school adjustment difficulties – one child at a time

## **New York State**





#### Evidence-based



- Over 60 years young
- SEL package as a targeted prevention program
- Universal screening and evaluation





- Helps with adjustment to school
- Relationship based
- An <u>early</u> intervention program
  - early in age: K-3
  - early in onset of difficulty
    - (mild to moderate)

#### Outside the Parameters



## Not:

- for children with diagnosed difficulties
- tutoring
- mental health treatment or counseling

## **Core Components**



- 1. Focus on young children
- 2. Systematic screening and selection
- 3. Use of individual in direct role
- 4. Changing role of mental health professional
- 5. On-going program evaluation
- 6. Integration





# Focus on young children (choose to target grade levels in K-3) for short term

- Typically seen 12-15 weeks in a given cycle (fall & spring)
  - One to one sessions 30-40 minutes in length

# **Core Component Two**




# Focus on systematic screening and appropriate selection

- All children in targeted grades
- Four to six weeks into school year
- Multiple sources of information
  - Qualitative and quantitative data

# Use of Paraprofessionals in a Direct Service Role

- Empathic and understanding
- Adequate training
- Child led strategies used, NOT play therapy
- Ability to follow, flexibility

# Core Component Four



# Use of mental health professional as supervisor, consultant and leader

- Warm and caring
- Understanding of intervention, non-directive, child-led
- Listens, supports, and guides
- Weekly time for supervision
- Liaison to teachers and parents
- Gatekeeper
- Master's level degree in mental health field

# **Core Component Five**



### **Ongoing Program Evaluation**

- Data (measures/instruments) collected via COMET (a web-based data management system).
- Evaluation reports reviewed annually and shared with stakeholders.

# **Core Component Six**



### Integration into school and community

- Link with RtI (behavioral)
- Continuum of care and support

## Application for Funds



#### **Key Points**

- Anticipated maximum of \$15,000 per school available for up to two schools in a district (max \$30,000 in year one).
- Funding over a 3 year period, decrease in years two and three.
- Maintenance of the same level of child associate time across grant period.

# Application for Funds



#### Key Points continued

- Money cannot be used for programs in a school implementing the program during the 19-20 year, funds intended to support new programs
- Sept/Oct 2020 start-up
  - Required introductory training for child associate/s, mental health supervisor, and project coordinator.
     Principal to attend at least day one.
  - Required training for mental health supervisors only

#### **Application process**



Primary Project services with implementation to begin in September 2020.

Applications are due November 20, 2019 by 5pm, sent electronically.

Notification: Spring 2020

### **Application for Funds**



#### **Budget Suggestions:**

- Child associate salaries, not professional salaries
- Screening and evaluation measures (varies)
- Primary Project resources one time fee per building
- Playroom Supplies (limit of \$500/building)
- Training (mandatory, no registration fee)
  - Sept/Oct 2020 : tentative location Rochester
  - Supervisor training Fall 2020
- Other statewide training
- Travel expenses
