# Tips for Virtual Primary Project Visits

## Set Up/Get Ready

Understand and have ready your child's Primary Project code and charged school ipad.

Child logs out of class and uses Primary Project code to log into visit.

Please make sure the Child Associate is logged in first, do not try to join early Have toy items ready near child and child ready to see their Child Associate- use attached toy suggestions if you do not have a kit from us.

#### **During the Visit**

Have an adult nearby for any tech difficulties: ex. signing on and signing off student visits

Try to limit distractions as much as possible from T.V. phone, etc. Child can use same learning environment as during classroom session i.e. desk, table, floor The Child Associate will help your child understand new virtual expectations to have a similar child-led experience.

## What to Expect from the Child Associate:

Use of supportive Reflective Language by the Child Associate
Listening and/or silence by the Child Associate or child
Repeating a child's question or rephrasing their question
Play is Child-Led, rather than adult directed
Sessions may vary in length, child may be comfortable for 10-15 minutes to start and later expand to 20 minutes.

#### At End

Child logs out and logs back into their classroom when the child associate ends the visit.

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# Toy suggestions for Remote Primary Project

Primary Project focuses on building relationships through reflective language and child-led play. This encourages imagination, curiosity, problem solving, confidence, verbal and non verbal communication, social skills, initiative/decision making, attention/focus, self-awareness and many other skills.

\* During a school closure we will try to provide you with a play kit to be used for Primary Project sessions. If that is not possible OR if your child misplaced their play kit, the items below can be used.

Please do not buy new toy items, whatever you have is fine.

<u>5-10 items is plenty....below are examples of simple, expressive play items. Please avoid toys with batteries.</u>

- Empty cardboard box/shoe box, empty paper towel tube, empty egg carton, old cooking pan, dixie/plastic cup, paper bag, paper plate, empty plastic yogurt/butter container, sea shell, pine cones, nature items, small blanket, towel, piece of fabric
- Baby dolls or stuffed animals, plastic wild animals/dinosaurs or plastic people figures, doll/animal families, army soldiers
- Babybottle/plastic cup, spoon, paper plate, play food/ small amount of uncooked pasta, kitchen towel/wash cloth
- Old purse, old wallet
- Matchbox or car/truck or other vehicle
- Dress up items hat, scarf
- Puppet, old sock
- Legos or small blocks
- Toy phone
- 1-3 crayons,paper/scrap paper, tape, playdough, yarn/string
